Functie: Consultant Forensic Clinical Psychologist, prof. Forensic Clinical Psychology Glasgow Caledonian University

Subject: Researches on psychopathic disorder and violence; the clinical application of this research to risk assessment; the situational risk factors for violence in institutions (PRISM), and the new measure of psychopathy, the CAPP .

### Jorge O. Folino

Functie: Professor of Psychiatry; director of the Courses of Mental Health Research, University of La Plata, Argentina

Subject: Latin American research in the interface of mental health and the law: past, present and future; subjects such as homicide or risk assessment in Latin America

### Karl Hanson

Functie: Senior Research Officer; conducting and supervising research on corrections, with a particular focus on sexual offenders and family violence.

Subject: Strong research designs for evaluating interventions with sexual offenders

### Robert Hare

Functie: Emeritus Professor of Psychology, University of British Columbia.

Subject: psychopathy, it's nature, assessment, and implications for mental health and criminal justice. He is the developer of the PCL-R and co-author of its derivatives

### John Hirdes

Functie: Professor of Health Studies and Gerontology, University of Waterloo & Scientific Director, Homewood Research Institute. Board Member of interRAI.

Subject: His primary areas of interest include geriatric assessment, mental health, health care and service delivery, health information management, social determinants of health, and quantitative research methods.

Functie: Professor and Head, Department of Forensic Mental Health Science, Institute of Psychiatry, King's College, University of London.

Subject: the links between the major mental disorders and criminality and violent behaviour

Subject: mentally ill offenders, the assessment and treatment of offenders, jury directions and decision making and medico-legal matters. He conducted research in violence risk prediction, psychopathy and the prevalence of mental illness in the criminal justice system.

Subject: Violence and psychosis and the mental health of early stage prisoners, in particular how it changes over time; research network OHRN-C
